ROLE OF THE INSTITUTE WITHIN THE GOVERNMENT STRUCTURE

The National Legal Institute Mongolia (NLI) was established in 2002 by the Government resolution no.121 and reorganized in 2009 by the approval of the Minister of Justice and Internal Affairs.

The National Legal Institute carries out research assisting the Government (mostly the Ministry of Justice) in formulating legal policy, and continuing legal education programs for professional lawyers. The Institute is also responsible for legal information distribution throughout the country.

1. LEGAL POLICY RESEARCH

- ✓ Promotion of the development of Mongolian legal system
- ✓ Legal policy research to assist the legislative drafting of the executive branch, particularly the Ministry of Justice
- ✓ Support and liaison all-party consultation in legal policy formulation and implementation

Main activities

- Legal policy research
- Regulatory assessments and evaluations of legislations and drafts
- Conferences, roundtable meetings, seminars on topical issues
- Nationally recognized legal journal "Rule of Law"
- Needs assessment of foreign technical assistance projects within the Minister for Justice's portfolio

Research library

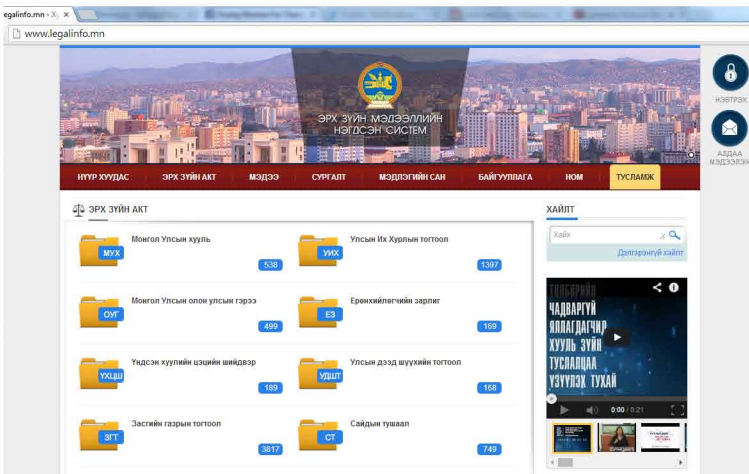
The most comprehensive and updated law library in the country, which is open to law students. The library is up to international standards that not only collects books and other resources, but provides legal and research references.

2. LEGAL INFORMATION

- ✓ Maintaining comprehensive legal information in digital and paper form
- ✓ Promotion of legal reform policy
- ✓ Support the public participation in lawmaking
- ✓ Support public awareness on human rights and empower special needs groups

Main activities

- Publication of the official gazette of normative acts by government ministries, agencies and other legal documents
- Facilitation of the public consultations on draft legislations
- Organizing informal legal trainings, workshops and lectures for the general public
- A monthly newsletter
- Publication of handbooks, handouts, visual materials, short TV and radio transmissions

The Integrated Legal Information system www.legalinfo.mn is the government maintained legal information database. Currently it has over 12 thousand legal acts and is the most accessed government website in Mongolia, which includes:

- Parliamentary statutes, resolutions and international conventions
- Presidential decrees, cabinet decrees, Ministerial orders
- Provincial governors' decrees, and assemblies' decisions
- Constitutional court decisions
- Other legal documents

3. LEGAL PROFESSIONALISM AND TRAININGS

- ✓ Supporting the legal professionalism for government lawyers, judges, prosecutors, advocates and law enforcement officers
- ✓ Supporting the higher legal education
- ✓ Supporting the legal knowledge and skills of government officers

- Continuing legal trainings for lawyers
- Other trainings, workshops and lectures
- Development of curriculums for legal re-training
- Development and publication of handbooks
- Conducting the bar exam upon delegation by the Ministry of Justice
